

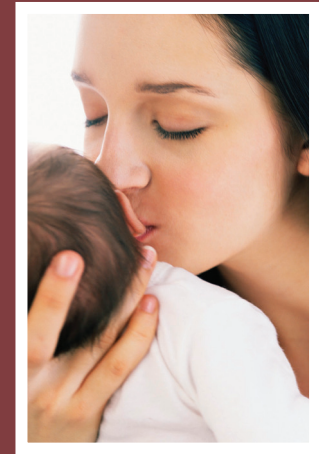

Free family planning for women and men

Plan First Covers:

- Yearly women's GYN exams
- Pap tests
- Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) testing
- Lab services for family planning and STI testing
- Prescription birth control
- Over-the-counter birth control*
- Sterilization procedures
- Education and counseling
- Transportation to covered family planning services

* With a prescription

Who is Eligible?

Women and men may be eligible if they:

- Live in Virginia
- Meet the monthly income limits*
- Are US citizens or qualified legal immigrants

*If you were on Medicaid or FAMIS MOMS while pregnant, you may qualify for Plan First.



How Do I Apply?

- 1) Apply online at www.commonhelp.virginia.gov or
- 2) Call Cover Virginia at 1-855-242-8282 to apply on the phone or
- 3) Print out and complete a paper application and mail it to your local Department of Social Services or
- 4) Visit your local Department of Social Services in the town or county in which you live.

Plan First Providers

Many health departments, community health centers, clinics, and private medical practices accept Plan First. Visit www.PlanFirst.org to find a provider near you.

Plan First pays for family planning services only.

If you get sick or need treatment for medical problems:
