

- This allows members significant choice hospitals and provider groups.



- DMAS requested an independent review to ensure members have easy access to the provider(s) of their choice.
- All six health plans met or exceeded the requirements.

Medallion 4.0 Overview

- Key program focus on:
 - Maternity care including early prenatal care, case management and postpartum care
 - Care for infants and children including Early Intervention services, immunizations, screening and preventive care
 - Wellness, behavioral health, community mental health services, behavioral therapy, family planning and chronic disease support for adults
 - Medicaid expansion eligible adults ages 19-64

Health Plan Added Benefits

- All six (6) health plans offer enhanced benefits to members, including, but not limited to:
 - Adult dental
 - Vision for adults
 - Cell phone
 - Centering pregnancy program
 - GED for Foster Care
 - Sports physicals at no cost (under age 21)
 - Swimming lessons for members six (6) years and younger
 - Boys and Girls Club membership (6-18 years old)
 - Free meal delivery after inpatient hospital stays
- Note: Not all health plans offer all of the same enhanced benefits.




Medallion 4.0 Medicaid Enrollment Updates



New enrollees will receive all services available to current members including evidence-based, preventive services


- Doctor, hospital and emergency services, including primary and specialty care

Virginia's Medicaid Smiles For Children Program



Virginia's Smiles For Children (SFC) Medicaid dental program is recognized as one of the top oral health programs in the country. Children, 20 years of age and younger, enrolled in SFC receive comprehensive dental benefits. Expanded dental benefits are also provided to adult pregnant women enrolled in Medicaid and FAMIS MOMS. Limited dental benefits are provided for Medicaid members over age 21.

DentaQuest serves as the Dental Benefits Administrator for the Smiles For Children program.

Virginia's *Smiles For Children* program offers benefits to over **950,000** Virginians



MEMBER SATISFACTION

- Satisfaction continued to be very high with the dentist, dental care received, and the Smiles For Children program.
- 85% have seen an improvement in their/their child's oral health in the past year.
- 98% felt the dentist/staff did everything they could to make them feel comfortable.

PROVIDER SATISFACTION

Providers continue to rate the Smiles For Children highly.

- 94% of providers plan to continue participating in the Smiles For Children program network next year
- 95% believed DentaQuest, the dental benefits administrator, was as good as or better than competitor dental insurance carriers






Services Provided in the Smiles For Children Program



Comprehensive dental services (cleanings, fillings, braces, crowns, etc) for all *Smiles For Children* members through 20 years of age.





Medically necessary dental services are the only covered services for adults (21 years and older) under the *Smiles For Children* program, with the exception of dental services for pregnant women.

Pregnant Women Dental Benefits

FAMIS MOMS

Pregnant women in Medicaid and FAMIS MOMS who are 21 years of age and older are eligible to receive benefits (excluding braces) through Virginia's *Smiles For Children* Program.





Pregnant Women

Dental benefits for pregnant women who are 21 years of age and older are discontinued at the end of the month following their 60th day postpartum.




Enhanced Services for Adults in Medallion 4.0 & CCC Plus

- Depending on the health plan, adults may receive services such as:
 - A routine dental exam
 - Cleaning(s)
 - X-rays
 - Fluoride treatment
 - Fillings
